11. PRESENT POSITION OF THE CHAPTER (include here a brief summary of the current year and the outlook for the future):

Despite the obstacles we still have to overcome, our chapter is optimistic about it's future. We just initiated our 4th ever largest incoming class, of 8 members, which continues our trend of steady growth towards that campus average. While we're suffering the pains of being a small chapter, we're a tight-knit group and we're working hard on improving our rush, to keep the large classes coming.

However, we're still suffering financially. We're having difficulties gathering the money we need to support our chapter. This has been an issue for some time now, and next term may turn out to be the breaking point. After budgeting this term, we have reservations about our next term. Despite cutting off as much as we can, low membership has driven our dues and rent "through the roof". However, we've taken steps, such as considering the "greekbill" system, to improving our situation.

Also, we've altered our rush strategy for next term, calling it "RAD", or Rush At Delta Chi. This last term, most of our new members came from smaller, informal events, and general "hanging out". So, because of the success of this informal style, we're going to attempt a full-scale "informal rush" next term. Combined with some loosened Rush rules by IFC, we feel our next term could be our best rush yet.'

So, overall, while we may have some obstacles to overcome, we have the drive and desire to do so, and are hopeful about the coming future.
